UNCG Police Crime and Safety Tips

These are just a few safety tips you can use to remain safe while on and off campus.

Three Basic Rules

1. **STAY ALERT!** Be aware of your surroundings, who's in front and behind you. Don't get distracted. Ask someone to walk with you whether it is a friend or the UNCG Safety Patrol – 334-5963.
2. **BE CONFIDENT!** Communicate the message that you are calm, confident and know where you are going. Stand tall, walk purposefully and make quick eye contact with people around you.
3. **TRUST YOUR INSTINCTS!** Make good decisions. If you feel uncomfortable in a place or situation, LEAVE!

On Campus

- Use discretion and caution when taking shortcuts through isolated parts of campus.
- Know the locations of the campus emergency phones on the route to and from class.
- If you are in an isolated area studying, working or alone in a lab, let someone know where you are and when you plan to leave.
- If you find yourself in danger, start yelling to draw attention to yourself.

Residence Halls

- NEVER PROP OPEN DOORS! This includes the exterior and room doors. Also, never let anyone "tailgate" you into the building. Shut the door as quickly as possible behind you.
- Never loan your residence hall keys.
- Keep your door locked at all times, whether you are in the room or only leaving for a short period of time.
- Door-to-Door solicitation is prohibited on campus. Please report the presence of solicitors to the Police Department.
- Immediately notify the Police Department and the Residence Life Staff of any suspicious individuals.
- If you leave for an extended vacation or campus break, take high value property with you.



Apartment or Home

- Install and use locks on your doors and windows. Keep doors locked day or night whether you are home or away.
- Know who is at the door before opening it. Demand ID from anyone you do not know.
- If someone comes to your door and asks to use the telephone to call for help, offer to make the call for them.
- Give your home a "someone is home" look. Put the radio and lights on a timer. And keep all main entrances well lit.
- Leave a spare key with a friend you trust, not in accessible places.
- Keep emergency numbers near the telephone.

Driving a car

- Have your keys in your hand as you approach your vehicle. Then check the back seat and floor before entering.
- Park in well lit areas. And keep valuables out of sight, under the seat or in the trunk.
- Keep an emergency kit containing a flashlight, flares, telephone change and a distress sign in your car.
- NEVER pick up hitch hikers.
- If your being followed, drive to the nearest police or fire station.
